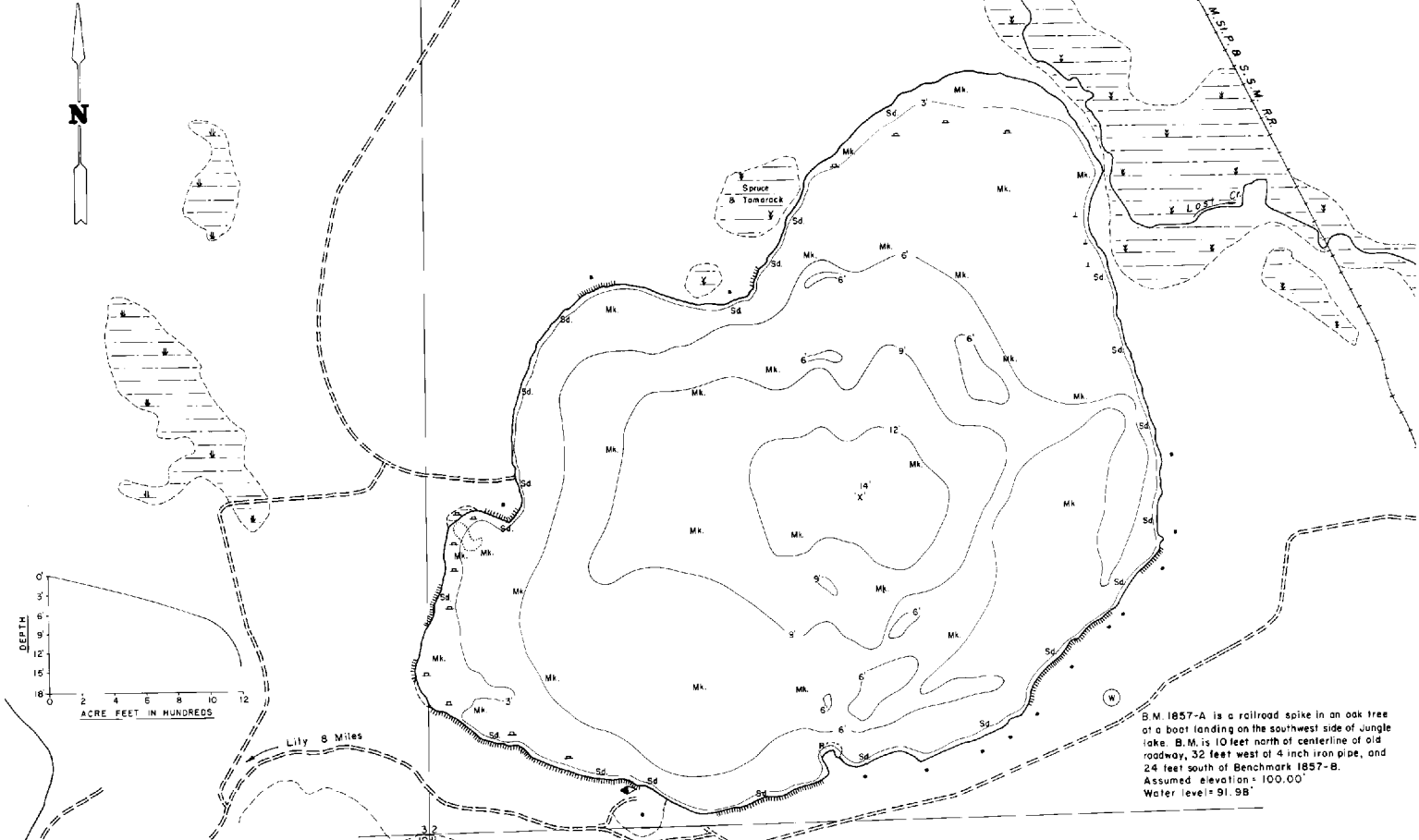

B.M. 1857-A is a railroad spike in an oak tree at a boat landing on the southwest side of Jungle lake. B.M. is 10 feet north of centerline of old roadway, 32 feet west of 4 inch iron pipe, and 24 feet south of Benchmark 1857-B. Assumed elevation = 100.00' Water level = 91.98'
